

Baby Blanket By NewE Designz



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Materials:

5 skeins of 4oz Baby Yarn

2 Yellow

1 Gray

1 White

1 Mint

5mm crochet hook Crochet sewing needle

Notes

I used Baby Bee Sweet Delight Yarn

Chain in Multiples of 3 when creating a larger or smaller blanket

Instead of turning and chaining I use the Stack Single Crochet. It leaves a nice smooth edge.



How to by Hope Corner Farm Crochet

Abbreviations:

Chain (ch)

Stitch (st)

Slip Stitch (slst)

Single Crochet (sc)

Double Crochet (dc)

Half Double Crochet (hdc)

Stack Single Crochet (ssc) See below

Gray

Ch 144, dc in 3rd ch from hook, dc in remaining chains across.

OR

DC Foundation 142:

How to do a Double Crochet Foundation by Hope Corner Farm Crochet

Yellow

Row 2: Turn, ssc in first st, dc in each st across. (142)

Row 3: Turn, ssc in first st, dc in same st, skip 2, *3dc in same st, skip 2*, 2dc in last st.

Mint

Row 4: Turn, scc in first st, 3dc in each space across, dc in last st.

Row 5: Turn, scc in first st, dc in each st across to last 2 st, skip 1 st, dc in last st. (142)

White (6 & 7)

Row 6–9: Repeat Rows 2-5

From here you will be repeating rows 2 – 5, until you have reached your desired length.

Once you have created your last stitch, you are going to start your edging by changing your color and turning your work.

Make sure all your tails are sewn in.

Border:

Rd 1: Sc. In the next st, you will use this technique, and placing 3 stitches in each corner:

Insert hook thru the left post of the sc, and into the next stitch of your blanket edge, yarn over







Pull through the stitch and the first loop on your hook, leaving 2 loops on your hook.





Yarn over and pull through both loops.







Rd 2: SSC in your beginning stitch of your edging, dc around, with 3dc in each corner:







Rd 3: Change color, sc in first st, hdc around, 3hdc in each corner. Finish off.







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
